

## SECOND AMENDMENT TO PROCLAMATION OF EMERGENCY RESTRICTIONS

WHEREAS, the County of Wake, with consent of incorporation by the City of Raleigh and the Towns of Apex, Cary, Fuquay-Varina, Garner, Holly Springs, Knightdale, Morrisville, Rolesville, Wake Forest, Wendell and Zebulon, declared a State of Emergency on March 13, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the City of Durham, and Towns of Angier and Clayton have also declared a State of Emergency and have municipal jurisdiction within portions of Wake County; and

WHEREAS, on March 26, 2020, the County of Wake, with consent of incorporation by the Cities of Raleigh and Durham and the Towns of Angier, Apex, Cary, Clayton, Fuquay-Varina, Garner, Holly Springs, Knightdale, Morrisville, Rolesville, Wake Forest, Wendell and Zebulon, enacted additional restrictions under a Proclamation of Emergency Restrictions ("Proclamation"); and

WHEREAS, on April 15, 2020, the County of Wake, with consent of incorporation by the Cities of Raleigh and Durham and the Towns of Angier, Apex, Cary, Clayton, Fuquay-Varina, Garner, Holly Springs, Knightdale, Morrisville, Rolesville, Wake Forest, Wendell and Zebulon, enacted a First Amendment to Proclamation of Emergency Restrictions ("First Amendment to Proclamation"), having an effective date of April 16, 2020; and

WHEREAS, there is a recognized need to clarify certain safety requirements for employees of businesses conducting delivery and curbside pickup in light of the inability of many employers to obtain thermometers due to the nationwide shortage; and

WHEREAS, the intent of this Second Amendment to Proclamation of Emergency Restrictions ("Second Amendment to Proclamation") is to make a technical correction with respect to delivery and curbside business operations and for all other provisions within the Proclamation and First Amendment to Proclamation, unless otherwise amended or superseded to remain in full force and effect.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the need for the business community to have clear guidance on safety protocols and the continued welfare and safety of residents of Wake County, including, by the request and consent of their respective Mayors, the residents of Apex, Cary, Fuquay-Varina, Garner, Holly Springs, Knightdale, Morrisville, Raleigh, Rolesville, Wake Forest, Wendell and Zebulon; and, for the portions of the Towns of Angier, Clayton and the City of Durham incorporated within the borders of Wake

County and by consent of the Mayors of Towns of Angier, Clayton and the City of Durham, the First Amendment to Proclamation is modified as follows:

## 1. <u>Section 1 (d) of the First Amendment to Proclamation is hereby repealed and replaced with the following:</u>

- d) Employers shall arrange for basic health screenings at the beginning of every employee's shift, which shall include a:
  - i) Discussion about any shortness of breath, coughing, or sore throat; and
  - ii) Discussion about any respiratory issues.

Employers are strongly encouraged, to the extent they are able, to also take the temperature of each employee. If an employee is exhibiting any of the above listed symptoms or has a temperature above 100.4 degrees, the employer should provide the employee with a face mask and require them to leave the workplace. Any employee with COVID-19 symptoms should be encouraged to call their primary care provider or the local health department.

I direct that copies of this Second Amendment to Proclamation be disseminated to the media for publication and broadcast, and that a copy be posted at the Wake County Courthouse and other public buildings as appropriate.

This Second Amendment to Proclamation dated April 17, 2020 supersedes only Section 1(d) of the First Amendment to Proclamation and to the extent not in conflict incorporates all prior declarations issued March 13, 2020, March 26, 2020, and April 15, 2020. This Second Amendment to Proclamation shall become effective on April 17, 2020 and shall continue until April 30, 2020 unless terminated, amended or rescinded earlier pursuant to N.C. Gen Stat. 166A-19.31(e).
