COVID-19

COVID-19 Exposure and Close Contact Policy

**Any direction not covered hereinafter please refer to guidelines established by the CDC.*

1. Should a staff member, rental holder or patron be **diagnosed** with COVID-19 within 5 days of the rental, it is expected that it will be reported to the Town of Rolesville (TOR) Parks and Recreation department **immediately** in order to take proper measures:
 - a. The staff member and the rental holder will be contacted via email and encouraged to be tested;
 - b. Staff or rental holder or patron that have been **diagnosed** with COVID-19 and meet the following criteria may return;
 - i. Received a **negative test taken at least 5 days after initially testing positive for COVID-19**. All negative test results must be presented to and approved by the Special Events Coordinator by 3pm the day of the event for eligibility to work the same day. If an event is on a Saturday, the negative test result must be submitted to the Special Events Coordinator by 3:00 PM on Friday.

OR
 - ii. Wait 10 days after being diagnosed with COVID-19.
2. Should a staff member, rental holder or patron be **exposed** to, or have **close contact** with COVID-19, it is expected that it will be reported to the Town of Rolesville (TOR) Parks and Recreation department **immediately** in order to take proper measures:
 - a. Those that have been exposed COVID-19 and meet the following criteria may return.
 - iii. Received a **negative test taken at least 5 days after initially being exposed to COVID-19 or having close contact with COVID-19**. All negative test results must be presented to and approved by the Special Events Coordinator by 3pm the day of the class for eligibility to participate the same day. If a program is on a Saturday, the negative test result must be submitted to the Special Events Coordinator by 3:00 PM on Friday.

OR
 - iv. Wait 10 days after being exposed to COVID-19.
3. Should a staff member, rental holder or patron **display symptoms** of COVID-19, **do not attend or return to programming**. It is expected that it will be reported to the Town of Rolesville (TOR) Parks and Recreation department **immediately** in order to take proper measures:
 - a. Those that displayed symptoms of COVID-19 and meet the following criteria may return to programming.
 - v. Received a **negative test taken at least 5 days after initially showing symptoms**. All negative test results must be presented to and approved by the Program Coordinator by 3pm the day of the class for eligibility to participate the same day. If a program is on a Saturday, the negative test result must be submitted to the Special Events Coordinator by 3:00 PM on Friday.

OR
 - vi. Wait 10 days after showing symptoms to COVID-19 **AND** it has been 24 hours since the participant has had a fever (without fever-reducing medicine) **AND** all symptoms of COVID-19 are improving.

Indoor Mask Policy (Cultural Programs)

FAQ

Q - What counts as an exposure?

A - Contact with someone infected with SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19, in a way that increases likelihood of getting infected with the virus.

Q - What counts as close contact?

A - Someone who was less than 6 feet away from an infected person (Laboratory-confirmed or a clinical diagnosis) for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period (for example, three individual 5-minute exposures for a total of 15 minutes).

Q - What type of test will be accepted?

A - A rapid test or a laboratory test

Q - What information does my test result need to show to be accepted?

A - Your test result should show your name, date of birth, collection date, acceptable type of test and a negative test result.

Q - Is my initial exposure or positive test date considered day 1 of my suspension?

A - No, your initial exposure or positive test date is counted as day 0, the following day is counted as day 1.

Q – Someone in my household tested positive. Can my participant still attend programming?

A – No, the other members of the household cannot attend programming. This is considered an exposure/close contact to COVID-19 for the duration of the positive individual’s quarantine phase or until the positive individual tests negative.

Day “0” is the last day of the infected person’s quarantine or the day the individual tested negative.
